- Benefits of cycling not fully understood by our stakeholders
- Needs of cyclists not fully understood by our stakeholders.

- Wider benefits (e.g. cycling makes our towns and cities great places to live).



A safer more attractive network for cycling (e.g. infrastructure, vehicles and management)








Sufficient knowledge and understanding of cycling



Urban Cycleways Fund

- January 30 First 13 projects announced
- March 2 Letter to Chief Executives calling for project proposals
- March 25 Deadline for project proposals
- April 10 Shortlisted projects confirmed
- May 30 UCF projects identified (target)
- June 30 UCF funding allocations announced (target) and NLTP.
