3. Work-plan for next twelve months	Noted that the current regulatory focus on vehicle emissions as the source of stormwater contamination from road run-off was not addressing significant sources of contaminants, while imposing an extra cost on roading projects. Agreed that there is a clear need for robust and credible guidance for a wider audience than has been reached to date, particularly regional councils and TA planners. Agreed that the group has data that could provide such guidance. Agreed to review the current FAQ series and material already assembled for the Stormwater Standard as a basis for developing better guidance. 4. Web-site development	Noted that the FAQs have been extensively reviewed and continue to be developed. Balt/Nicci	Wayne
5. Report from NZTA on new erosion and sediment control standard.	Received a report from Craig. Noted the drafting is nearly completed for a national standard that will meet all regional council criteria and will operate beside the Stormwater Standard, with the release for feedback from the industry through a series of two-day workshops in as many regions as possible expected from late August. Development of Guidelines for Stormwater Treatment for Planners by MoT and MfE	Received a report from Hamish (under item 2). Noted that there has been little progress on the draft Guidelines since the meeting of the group on 5 November as a result of a lack of resources, but concerns regarding the robustness of the draft have been noted and there will be a thorough internal review before the draft is released for peer review or technical edit, with this internal review being within three to six months. Agreed that guidelines are needed, but the present draft might be inadequate. Nicci to continue to liaise. Balt/Craig	Nicci/Hamish

7. Stormwater Seminars	Received a report from Hayden. Noted ARC is expecting about 250 practitioners to attend the 21 July seminars on the state of the environment, climate change, LID and associated issues. Noted ARC is still working on the review of technical papers, assessing floating vegetative treatment in ponds in a three-year study, use of crushed mussel-shells in sand filters, and planning a study to define and characterise the "first flush" in road run-off. 8. Research	Received a report on the progress of the NIWA project to evaluate innovative stormwater treatment devices. Noted that the study protocols are finalised and the potential devices and sites have been identified. Balt/Nicci	
9. Web-site use	Received a report on the web-site. Noted that the group's pages and resource were continuing to receive a significant share of the visits to the RCAF web-site. Agreed on the need to keep the web-site current. Balt/Dale	
10. General business	Received a report from Craig and Nicci on the NZIHT 'Paving the way for greener roads' conference and from Hayden and Craig on 'Stormwater 2010'. Noted that, while the 'greener roads' conference offered new issues and solutions, the Stormwater 2010 conference seemed to offer nothing new. Craig/Nicci
