






THE CODE



An operational view of the issues

- Change in relationships
- Increased need to back up any desired conditions
- Work to agree better solutions within the Code framework
- Recognise the balance of rights and responsibilities




An operational view of the issues

- Both ourselves and our partners must undertake the specific and joint responsibilities of the Code
- As well as coordinating works we must ensure and enforce compliance - ourselves and our utility
- There are a number "musts" in the Code


Corridor Managers


- Co-ordinate where practicable work in the corridor (road)
- Reasonable care not to damage other parties infrastructure or cause unnecessary disruption
- Organise liaison meetings
- Receive and process notifications/requests
- Set reasonable conditions (by agreement)
- Communicate with stakeholders
- Declare Conflicts of Interest



Utility operators

- Share forward work programmes
- Notify CM's of impending work
- Maintain accurate records on location of assets and advise on location
- Attend liaison meetings
- Manage their agents
- Comply with reasonable conditions
- Reasonable care not to damage other parties infrastructure or cause unnecessary disruption
- Declare Conflicts of Interest




And then there is UFB

- Strong national body


MEMBERSHIP



Membership framework introduced April 2013

- Full Member (corridor manager or utility operator)
 - Nominate staff for appointment to committee
 - Nominate staff for working groups
- Associate Member (including all others)

IMPORTANCE OF MEMBERSHIP



- Strong voice
- Some may only want associate membership
- Groupings of Councils may work (with a single full membership)
- Full membership will enable better direct communications
- But one way or the other not getting on board now will come back to bite
