# **Teleconference summary**

Reviewed terms of reference of working group

## **Comments from new members**

Southland- focus should be on configuration-related degradation of pavements

Tasman- data produced similar rates per tonne to Ruapehu DC

We need a more robust definition for what constitutes a single forest harvest event

Malborough- second tranche of forestry is more geographically diverse

Used RMA and district plan to recover harvest impact costs

#### **General comments:**

Whanganui- Test case for a 5 year harvest on a sealed road underway- detailed data

Planning collaboration between industry and asset owners required to add credibility to final guidelines.

Some good examples of working industry-RA collaboration

### **Conclusions**

- Progress intent of; 'Each group member to search for at least one (up to five) single forest
  harvest events (exclude perpetual or continuous harvest), for which the date is known (ideally
  since 1999), that had single or simple access and pull up the pavement maintenance history for
  that road. Where possible, pull up the maintenance history for a similar road that is known not
  to have had forest harvest for comparison'
- Further investigation of using district plan to trigger funding may form part of final guidelines
