Perception Survey Results December 2014

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Method


- Conducted survey between October and November 2014;
- Includes:
 - Invitiation to stakeholders
 - o Survey/ Interviews
- Received 79 respondents from Nelson;
- 58 out of 69 that answered this question cycle at least occasionally (at least a couple of times per month).

1. Cycle Lane Marking Options


- The plain M2-3 marking is understood by the majority of respondents.
 - \circ $\,$ 82% think that it means 'cars cannot drive in this lane'.
 - \circ 78% think that it means that 'cars cannot park over this marking'.
 - 89% consider this a good or very good way to clearly cycle lanes.
- The **M2-3 marking with green background** scored higher for understanding than other markings.
 - \circ 84% think that it means 'cars cannot drive in this lane'.
 - o 75% think that it means that 'cars cannot park over this marking'.
 - 84% consider this a good or very good way to clearly cycle lanes.
- The **M2-3 marking with the word LANE** scored slightly higher than the marking without the word.
 - \circ 89% think that it means 'cars cannot drive in this lane'.
 - A similar 84% think that it means that 'cars cannot park over this marking'.
 - Four out of five of respondents (80%) consider this a good or very good way to clearly cycle lanes.



All, n=78; Q: What do you think this marking means?








Q2.3: What do you think this marking means?




2. Sharrows

- Sharrows in **Midblock**
 - Nine out of ten (92%) think that the Sharrow markings meant that bikes and cars should share the road.
 - 57% consider Sharrows to be a good treatment where road width is not wide enough for a cycle lane.
 - \circ 41% of the respondents consider Sharrows to improve safety of cyclists.
 - Half of the respondents (51%) consider that motorists will look for cyclists when they see this marking
 - Note, there was no additional information provided, results would change with education.
- Sharrows at the approach to a roundabout (intersection)
 - Nine out of ten (94%) think that the Sharrow markings meant that bikes and cars should share the road.
 - One in two (48%) consider Sharrows to be a good way to mark intersections, or that they would improve safety.
 - Approximately one in two (42%) consider Sharrows to improve safety of cyclists.
 - Half of the respondents (49%) consider that motorists will look for cyclists when they see this marking
 - Note, there was no additional information provided, results would change with education.
- Positioning of Cyclists
 - Majority of the respondents (75%) considers that the location of Sharrow markings does not indicate where cyclists should ride on the road




Q2.7: What do you think this marking means?









