

Technical disciplines

The Technical disciplines section houses the technical information that employees, contractors and suppliers of the NZ Transport Agency need to be aware of to complete Highways tasks and projects to current specifications.





Register

The Register section links you to an Excel spreadsheet that houses a definitive list of all published NZ Transport Agency specification documents.

This can be searched and filtered and links you to the document you are searching for.

It is another way of being able to find information quickly on the HIP.



NZ Transport Agency register of network standards and guidelines

The Register of network standards and guidelines governs the Transport Agency's technical standards, guidelines, and manuals.

The register aims to provide:

- A definitive list of all relevant NZ Transport Agency funding policy, commonly adopted manuals and technical documents for land transport network related activities.
- A simple, easily accessible repository of land transport network reference documents for approved organisations, staff, consultants, contractors and other users.

This register is to replace all previous versions of Standards and guidelines manuals of Land Transport NZ and Transit NZ.

Using the register

Using the register is fairly simple.


- Open the register Excel spreadsheet.
- · Filter the contents using the drop down menu in the top row headings. For example:
- If you know you are looking for a specification numbered 'S6' but don't know what it is actually about, you can filter on the 'Reference Number' column to find it.
- If you know you are looking for a document titled 'Cost estimation manual', you can filter using the 'Full title' column.
- If you know the document belongs to, or was made by a particular person, filter for their name using the 'Document contact/ owner' column.
- If you don't have any of these details, but do know something about what you are looking for, use the 'Find' tool within excel. You can search on any
 words or numbers this way, without having to have any specific details.
- Once you have found what you are looking for, go through the document link or copy and paste it into a new internet browser window to get to the file.



Forms

The Forms section is where you can easily find templates and forms relevant to Highways projects.

This gives you a quick, direct way to reach the commonly used documents you need without going through other pages to find it.






Links

These links include NZ Transport Agency sites as well as other relevant industry group and government websites.






News

Updates on the HIP, new or revised technical specifications, newsletters, etc are all reported here.






Technical advice note
