




#### **New Chief Executive appointed**

## WHAT is the CIVIL TRADES REGIME?

A certification process managed by Industry to formally recognise employees who have reached Tradesperson competency

#### **TRADESPERSON** demonstrates:

- Ability to work unsupervised, safely, efficiently and to the required standard
- ➤ High degree of practical and theoretical knowledge of their trade beyond skilled labourer or plant operator

## WHY we need CTR?

- CTR provides skills recognition
- > Skills recognition ensures:
  - Work is undertaken safely
  - Provision of work to specification
  - Reduction in rework
  - Assurance and confidence in skills and capability of contractors

## WHO will benefit from CTR?

## Meeting the needs of

- 1. Employees: recognition & career path
- 2. Employers: increase productivity & safety, decrease rework, attract and retain staff
- 3. Infrastructure Sector: increase capability & capacity address aging workforce
- **4. Government priorities:** skilled workforce, increase household income, reliable infrastructure, increase innovation

## HOW does Civil Trade Regime (CTR) Work?

#### Apprentice achieves:

- Level 4 Trade Qualification (approx. 4,000 working hours)
- Completes another 4,000 hours demonstrating the specified competencies to gain the required experience and proven skill level
- Applies to Trades Certification Board to be certified as a Tradesperson
- Certified Tradesperson if requirements met

## How does the CTR Work?

- > FIVE Level 4 Trade Certificates available
  - 1. Civil Works
  - 2. Utilities Maintenance
  - 3. Pipe Installation
  - 4. Bituminous Surfacing
  - 5. Bituminous Product Manufacturing

Each focuses on a specific scope and not generalist labourer or operator skills, as previously

## WHEN will CTR start?

#### **Late 2015:**

- > Enrol first trainees into Trade Qualification Pathway
- ➤ Level 3 and 4 Qualifications listed by NZQA
  - > Combines number of unit standards into one assessment

#### ➤ Mid 2015:

➤ 5 selected trainees enrolled in pilot Recognised Current Competency (RCC)

#### >2016:

**▶** Recognised Current Competency available to industry

## How can you Help?

- > Support and endorse the Trades Regime
- > Include in relevant industry communications
- > Provide resources to help its establishment
- ➤ Provide trainees for enrolment in the Trade Cert
  Pathway 2015
- Recommend it be included as a procurement requirement where relevant
