

Active modes infrastructure and

“inactive mode” users

i.e. Mobility scooters

- Increasing issue for rural centres – aging population, local care facilities, community hospitals
- Issue for TTM, reinstatement, maintenance and infrastructure design



Funding HCV impacts on LVR

Limits of current funding model:

- equitable treatment in funding local share –
 - *T/Ha from rural land uses over 30 years*

• Forestry	525 tonnes
• Dairying	338 tonnes
• Drystock pastoral farming	14 tonnes
 - *Ratio of rates to average annual T/Ha*

• Forestry	1
• Dairying	17.25
• Drystock pastoral farming	132

Funding options being considered

- Mitigation
- Cost recovery
 - Differential rating
 - Enhanced targeted rate
 - Regional RUC
 - MOU
- Divestment

Code for Utilities' Access to Transport Corridors

- Review completed and Code with Minister
- Approved Code due back in late July
- Changes likely to be implemented a month later
- Training on the Code is an identified need
- Members need to ensure every utility and contractor has been educated and trained
- NZIHT still offering 2-day overview and 1-day worker in the road courses
- Short courses on effects of changes in the Code also being offered later this year – see fliers
