

Continuing research activities

Glyphosate resistance

- Resistance is inherited, in pollen and becomes the dominant trait where spraying occurs (Massey)
- One plant setting seed can render a field useless for arable farming in only three years (US study)
- \$592/ha spray mix is no more effective than a \$36.20/ha mix
- Weeds resistant to glyphosate also become resistant to (or tolerant of) amitrole and glufosinate
- Do not repeat-spray, even with mixes; rotate different sprays every 5 to 8 applications

Mobility scooters

- Increasing issue for rural centres aging population, local care facilities, community hospitals




Level Crossings Working Group
