National Road classification is:

the orderly *grouping of roads* according to the type of service they provide to users.

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National Classification assists:

in establishing the geometric design features for each *group of roads*, consistent with the short and long term operational needs of that particular group.





National Classification outcome:

Road systems operate most safely and efficiently as each *group of road* is designed to serve its intended purpose taking into account users, context and value for money.
