




Driving dominates, but other transport modes plays important role

Auckland, Nelson and Bay of Plenty are the most dissatisfied with congestion




Whanganui, Auckland and South Canterbury are the most dissatisfied with driver behaviour




Wairarapa, Northland and Nelson are the most dissatisfied with the road design for cyclist & pedestrian safety

- 1% had ridden both an e-bike and bike – suggesting they are unique groups of users










Members' satisfaction with local bike trips




